

Smoke Alarm Checklist - It is Important

Did you know that smoke alarms let you know when there is a fire? Working smoke alarms give you time to get outside and stay outside. The Alamo Heights Fire Department would like to continue fire safety and education not just during fire prevention week, but throughout the year.

The National Fire Protection Agency "Sparky" campaign provides many excellent

safety flyers for children and adults. Check out the "Fire Prevention Week Checklist" with your family, and call us with any questions or concerns.

Take a look around your home. You need a smoke alarm on every floor and inside every bedroom. Remember to press the test button on each and every one to make sure they work. Make sure to print and post the "Smoke Alarm Calendar Checklist," too. Remember, Home Fire Safety Inspections are FREE!

If there are some boxes not checked, work together to help fix the problem (PDF English and Spanish) or get

assistance from the fire department non-emergency number 824-1281.

Reminder AH is now in Stage 1

City of Alamo Heights Water System is in Stage 1 Water Restrictions.

Watering (using automatic or manual irrigation systems) is permitted only once a week before 10 a.m. and after 8 p.m. The last number of your address determines what day you are able to water.

Last number of your Address	Watering Day
0 or 1	Monday
2 or 3	Tuesday
4 or 5	Wednesday
6 or 7	Thursday
8 or 9	Friday
Multi-Family premises, schools, churches and commercial users	Wednesday

You may use drip irrigation, soaker hose or hand-held hose during any day at any time.

Remember School Zone Safety



With school to begin on August 24th, the AH Police Department urges all motorists to use caution and be alert while driving on streets around the school campuses and anywhere children may be walking or riding their bicycles to school. Students are easily distracted this time of year and may inadvertently get too far away from the curb or cross the street without looking both ways. The City of

Alamo Heights has an excellent safety record around the schools and we should do everything possible to maintain safety for the children.

Please remember the speed limit in all school zones is 20 m.p.h. Also, the use of hand-held communication devices while a vehicle is in motion is prohibited in certain school zone areas. Areas where hand-held communication devices are prohibited include St. Luke's Lane, the 6800 – 7100 blocks of

Broadway (Alamo Heights H.S.), and all streets within the posted school zones of St. Peter's School and Cambridge Elementary to include the 5400 – 5900 blocks of Broadway.

Streets around school campuses can become heavily congested before and after school. If traveling through or near a school zone, please plan accordingly and expect delays.
