# **Vacation Patrol Service**



With Spring Break approaching and families planning vacations the Alamo Heights Police Dept. wanted to remind residents about the Vacation Patrol Service. Citizens who will be leaving their homes unattended while on vacation or during extended trips may request additional patrols. Officers will stop by your residence periodically during your absence and will report suspicious findings to your designated contact person.

Remember that during times when your residence is unoccupied you should always give the appearance of someone being home. Have a responsible person collect your newspapers and mail on a daily basis, keep plants watered and grass cut, have lights/televisions/radio on timers, and alert your trusted neighbors to your absence so they can be aware of any suspicious activity during your absence. Equally important, if you are leaving your dogs on your property under the care of another person, please be sure they are wearing collars with identification or rabies tags and indicate on your close patrol form who is the responsible person should your dog get out.

All requests are considered high security and information provided will be protected.

### **Yardwork Regulations**

With Spring approaching many residents are beginning to work on landscaping projects and hiring contractors to complete yard work.

- Reminder contractors who are providing landscape and/or tree trimming services are required to remove all tree/shrub limb cuttings, grass clippings and leaves after they complete the work.
- All grass clippings or leaves are to be bagged and hauled off by the contractor and not blown onto public streets or bagged and left for the City to dispose of.
- Contractors are not to begin working before 10:00 a.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and City-observed holidays.

#### **Mosquito Control**

With all the moisture in the air mosquitoes have found ideal breeding grounds. By following some tips residents can assist with the effort to reduce the mosquito numbers and helps protect yourself from being bitten.

- DRAIN Eliminate any potential standing water on your property.
- DEFEND Use an EPA-registered mosquito repellent such as DEET, Picardidin or oil of lemon eucalyptus.
- DRESS Wear light colored, loose fitting clothing that minimizes skin exposure.

with **electricity** throughout your home.




There are **nearly 47,800** home electrical fires each year.



About **half** of these involve lighting equipment or home electrical wiring.

Plug only **one** heat-producing appliance (such as a coffee maker, space heater, or microwave) directly into a wall outlet at a time.





Home electrical fire deaths peak between **midnight** and 6 a.m.





Nearly half (46 percent) of electrical fire deaths happen in December through March.

Never use an extension cord with a heat-producing appliance.
