Halloween Fire Safety Tips

Halloween is a fun, and spooky time of year for kids. Make trick-or-treating safe for your little monsters with a few easy safety tips.

- When choosing a costume, stay away from billowing or long trailing fabric. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so they can see out.
- Provide children with flashlights to carry for lighting or glow sticks as part of their costume.
- Tell children to stay away from open flames. Be sure they know how to stop, drop and roll if their clothing catches fire. Have them practice stopping immediately, dropping to the ground, covering their face with hands, and rolling over and over to put the flames out.
- Use flashlights as alternatives to candles or torch lights when decorating walkways and yards. They are much safer for trick-or treaters, whose costumes may brush against the lighting.
- If your children are going to Halloween parties at others' homes, have them look for ways out of the home and plan how they would get out in an emergency.

Dfd you know?

Decorations are the first thing to ignite in more than 1,000 reported home fires each year.

Time Change, Battery Change



The Alamo Heights Fire Dept. would like to remind everyone that along with changing your clock time for Daylight Savings Time, to also change the batteries in your smoke detectors. Sunday, November 1st is the time to "fall"

back" and also give your smoke detectors a fresh start.

Smoke detectors provide a tremendous level of safety for

occupants, alerting them to a possible deadly house fire. They are only as effective as the batteries that keep them "looking" for smoke.

It is important to stay prepared for the unexpected, including the threat of a house fire. The colder months combined with the upcoming holiday season provide more potential for a possible fire. Space heaters, cooking large meals with family distractions and even holiday decorations can be factors that may increase the risk of a house fire. Visit www.alamoheightsfire.com for safety flyers.

Google Fiber Testing in Alamo Heights

Google Fiber is in the process of validating their general plan within rights of way of several cities within Bexar County. They are evaluating to see if certain cities will be included in the broader San Antonio build out.

informed to let residents know they are doing work for Google Fiber - though their vehicles will have their own firm markings.
