Watering (using automatic or manual irrigation systems is permitted **only once a** week between the hours 7:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. The last number of your address determines what day you are able to water.

0 or 1	Monday
2 or 3	Tuesday
4 or 5	Wednesday
6 or 7	Thursday
8 or 9	Friday
Multi-Family premises, schools, churches and commercial users	Wednesday

You may use drip irrigation, soaker hose, or bucket (5-gallon or less container) during any day of the week but only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.

A hand-held hose may be used during any day of the week at any time.

Back to School Safety Tips - Walking, Bicycle or Riding the Bus

School Buses Are Like Traffic Signals



Whether children walk, ride their bicycle or take the bus to school, it is extremely important that they take proper safety precautions. Here are some tips to make sure your child safely travels to school.

When walking to school:

- Walk on the sidewalk, if one is available. When on a street with no sidewalk, walk facing the traffic.
- Before you cross the street, stop and look all ways to see if cars are coming.
- Never dart out in front of a parked car. •
- Practice walking to school with your child.

When riding a bicycle to school:



- Teach your children the rules of the road they need to know to ride their bicycles.
- Ride on the right side of the road and in a single file.
- Come to a complete stop before crossing the street.

Riding the bus to school

- Go to the bus stop with your child to teach them the proper way to get on and off the bus.
- Make sure your children stand six feet away from the curb. If your child and you need to cross the street in front of the bus, walk on the side of the road until you are at least 12 feet ahead of the bus.
- You always should be able to see the bus driver, and the bus driver always should be able to see you.

5 GIANT STEPS

ten feet away from the bus (or as far away as they can) and never go behind it They should take five giant steps in front of the bus before crossing, so they can be seen by the driver.
