**Precincts:** 3020, 3025 and 3026 **When:** 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.

**Early Voting:** Alamo Heights voters will be able to vote at any polling site throughout Bexar County, beginning **Monday, April 27th through Tuesday, May 5th.**Varying times and polling sites are available on website, www.alamoheightstx.gov.

Closest early voting polling sites to Alamo Heights are:

- Lion's Field Community Center located at 2809 Broadway
- Olmos Park City Hall located at 120 W. El Prado
- Tobin Library located at 4134 Harry Wurzbach

Curbside Voting is available during both Early Voting or on Election Day

- If you are physically unable to enter the polling place, you may ask that an election officer bring a ballot to you at the entrance of the polling place or to your car at curbside
- Plan ahead so election officials will expect you. Call 210-335-0362 to arrange curbside voting in advance.

Seven pet waste stations have been installed throughout the City: 3 along the La Jara median, 1 at the ball fields, 1 at the Jack Judson Nature Trail, 1 at the community garden and 1 at Vanderhoven and Castano. Each station include a "mutt mitt" bag dispenser, a steel trash can with lid, and a small sign that is attached to a steel pole to provide for a clean and easy way to pick up after your dog on walks around these popular routes.

# Vacation Patrol Service



With Spring Break approaching and families planning vacations the Alamo Heights Police Dept. wanted to remind residents about the Vacation Patrol Service. Citizens who will be leaving their homes unattended while on vacation or during extended trips may request additional patrols. Officers will stop by your residence periodically during your absence and will report suspicious findings to your designated contact person.

Remember that during times when your residence is unoccupied you should always give the appearance of someone being home. Have a responsible person collect your newspapers and mail on a daily basis, keep plants watered and grass cut, have lights/televisions/radio on timers, and alert your

trusted neighbors to your absence so they can be aware of any suspicious activity during your absence. Equally important, if you are leaving your dogs on your property under the care of another person, please be sure they are wearing collars with identification or rabies tags and indicate on your close patrol form who is the responsible person should your dog get out.

## Winter Averaging Rates

Winter Averaging monitors the amount of water you use during the three complete billing cycles. The city uses the months of Nov., Dec., and Jan. consumption to average your sewer rate. Spikes or excessive water consumption during Winter Averaging months can cause your sewer bill to increase. If you experienced a leak during this period, the City does have an adjustment policy provided you can document repair of a leak. The new sewer rate will be reflected on your April bill.
