Year Round Water Regulation *Stage 1 Water Restrictions have been lifted but the City does have Year-Round Water Regulations.*

- Automatic or manual irrigation systems are allowed any day of the week but only before 10 a.m. and after 8 p.m.
- Hand watering with a hand-held hose, soaker hose, drip irrigation system or bucket is allowed any time during the day
- Remember that any sprinkler system must be equipped with a rain sensor to prevent the system from operation during periods of rain.

Sleepover Checklist

Before you permit your child to sleepover with a friend, talk to the child's parents," says Judy Comoletti, NFPA's Division Manager for Public Education. "Depending on what you learn, it can either uncover serious fire dangers or give you peace of mind during your child's sleepover."

Below is a checklist to help parents and caregivers consider hazards and make decisions about slumber parties and sleepovers.

Before you say "yes"...

- How well do you know the home? Is the home clean?
- Does it appear to be structurally sound?
- Is the home in a safe area?
- If the home has security bars on doors and windows, do you know for certain that the bars have quick release devices inside, so your child could get out in an emergency?
- Are you comfortable leaving your child in the home overnight?

- How well do you know the parent(s)? Are they mature, responsible and conscientious? Will they supervise the children throughout the stay?
- Are they cautious with smoking materials, matches and lighters, and candles?

Ask the parents...

- Are there working smoke alarms on every level, inside and outside each sleeping area?
- Do they have a well-rehearsed fire escape plan that includes two ways out and a meeting place outside? Will the parents walk through their escape plan with your child?
- Where will your child be sleeping? Is there a smoke alarm in the room? Are there two escape routes from the room?
- Do the parents prohibit bedroom candle use by children?

Pet Safety



Be especially careful if you are vacationing and leaving your pet(s) at home. Pets begin to miss their families almost immediately and can escape to go

looking for them. It is important that they wear their collars with identification and vaccination tags. When submitting a house watch, please be sure to include the name and contact information for the animal's caretaker so that we may contact them if necessary.

Animals need special attention during the hot summer months. Make sure your pet has a cool dog house or shelter, always have plenty of cool water (water that sits outside during hot weather will get very hot and undrinkable), food, and remember not to have your pet restrained or tied up outside. NEVER leave your pet in a car. The heat that builds up inside a vehicle can be fatal.
