

# National Telecommunicators Week - Thank You!

Public Safety Dispatchers are always there to answer the call and serve the community 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. They are the "first" of our first responders that keep the community and our Officers and Firefighters safe.

National Public Safety Telecommunicator Week was first conceived by Patricia Anderson of the Contra Costa County (Calif.) Sheriff's Office in 1981 and was quickly adopted in Virginia and North Carolina. By the 1990s, the National Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (APCO) convinced Congress of the need for a formal proclamation.

In 1994, National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week was formally recognized and is celebrated each year during the second full week of April to coincide with National 9-1-1 Education Month. This year National Telecommunicators Week is April 14th - 20th.



# What is Recyclable?

The recycling industry is experiencing high levels of contamination which is trash or items with food or liquid residue in the recycling. When non-recyclable items (contamination) end up in the recycling loads, they have the potential to turn the entire load into trash.

Remember only certain items can be recycled:

- Metal Cans steel, tin & aluminum soda, vegetable, fruit, and tuna cans after they are rinsed
- Plastic bottles & containers cups, bowls, food trays, and tubs
- Flattened Cardboard & Paperboard
- Glass bottles & Jars
- Paper brown paper bags, nonconfidential office paper, newspaper, magazines, phone books
- Paper Cardboard, Dairy & Juice Containers - after they are rinsed



- Plastic bags, polystyrene foam cups, hangers or hazardous waste
- Food-soiled items tissues, paper towels, cardboard, or other paper that has been in contact with food
- Bulky items such as propane tanks or construction debris
- "Tanglers" like rubber hoses and wires they can shut down an entire recycling center
- Sharp and dangerous materials like needles and electronics
- Separate plastic lids from plastic bottles (often made from different materials).
- Do not place medical waste (needles, catheters or lancets) into the recycling containers.

Do not bag your recyclables - plastic bags and film get tangled in the machinery. Visit www.alamoheightstx.gov/departments/public-works/solidwaste/ for more information and solid waste pickup schedule.
