As of Monday, August 5th E. Fair Oaks is a One-Way street going east from Broadway to Vanderhoeven Dr. This was approved in order to replace the parallel parking spaces along the north curb line with sixty-degree angled head-in parking spaces adding additional parking around Alamo Heights High School to alleviate parking concerns in the neighborhood due to the construction project at the school.

School Zone Safety

School begins on August 19th. AH Police Department urges all motorists to use caution and be more alert while driving on streets around the school campuses and anywhere children may be walking or riding their bicycles to school. Students are easily distracted this time of year and may inadvertently get too far away form the curb or cross the street without looking both ways.

Remember the speed limit in ALL school zones is 20 m.p.h.

Streets around school campuses can become heavily congested before and after school. If traveling through or near a school zone, please plan accordingly and expect delays.



1: OBEY TEXAS SCHOOL BUS LAW

- Stop for flashing red lights on a school bus, regardless of which direction you're headed
- Continue your trip once the flashing lights stop flashing
- Violations can lead to a \$1,000 fine



2: NO CELL PHONES IN SCHOOL ZONES

- No cell phone use in school zones
- Drivers under the age of 18 are prohibited from using wireless communication devices
- All drivers are prohibited from texting or receiving messages using handheld devices while driving in school zones

Year Round Water Conservation

With temperatures continuing to increase and less rainy days, we would like to remind our citizens that the City has a Year-Round Water Regulation.

- Outdoor watering with a sprinkler or irrigation system is allowed any day of week before 10 a.m. and after 8 p.m.
- Hand watering with a hand-held hose, soaker hose, drip irrigation system
 - or bucket is allowed any time during the day.
- All sprinkler systems must be equipped with a rain sensor to prevent the system from operation during periods of rain.
