Broadway/Austin Highway Area Parking Update

As construction continues on the project at Austin Highway and Broadway, City Council and Staff remain sensitive to the needs of our citizens and visitors. We will provide updates from time to time and the City's Website will continue to be updated regarding upcoming work.

On June 5th, Council discussed parking issues to help alleviate some of the congestion on interior streets such as Circle Street, Fennimore and Ellwood. The goal is to take parking off the interior streets, to the extent possible, while trying to best deal with the interests of the residents on Circle Street, the employees and customers of the Cambridge Shopping Center (Paloma Blanca and others), the residents/guests of Brighton Square Condominiums and residents/guests of the future apartment complex.



Council implemented a pilot program that will cause the new head-in parking spaces that have been constructed to the north and east of the Cambridge Shopping Center to be dedicated to employee parking only. The hope is that more patrons will park in the shopping center itself, with less lengthy employee parking on our streets. The program will be re-visited in the fall to determine what adjustments are needed.

In the meantime, Council asked City Staff to evaluate resident parking only and/or two-hour parking on certain areas of Circle Street and restricting the interior of the circle to residential parking only. We hope to pass some of these measures in the next few months. I thank all of those who attended the meeting for their constructive thoughts, especially those living on Circle Street and those living in the Brighton Square Condominiums.

Aquifer Water Levels

The EAA website www.edwardsaquifer.org/ is a great resource in understanding the water level readings as well as the water usage restrictions when in drought conditions.

The Edward's Aquifer Authority (EAA) monitors the water levels of the San Antonio and Uvalde Pools. These levels are measured around the clock utilizing different devices within the monitoring wells throughout the aquifer. The water level data regulates the criteria for determining when to impose the groundwater withdrawal restrictions for aquifer users, such as Alamo Heights, during droughts. The ten-day average triggers the water restriction stages.
