I am pleased to announce that the City remains in a very strong financial position. We continue to maintain an AAA bond rating. Over the last several years, the City Council has been diligent with preparing the budget and our staff always looks for ways to economize without affecting our quality of life.

Many of you may not know that the property on which the Alamo Heights Swimming Pool, Nature Trails, Little League baseball fields, and A.H. High School baseball fields are located is actually owned by the City of San Antonio. Through the efforts of staff and City Council members, we successfully negotiated a 40-year lease extension with the City of San Antonio, allowing us to continue using this land for recreational purposes.

With this lease extension, we have ensured the continuity of use of places that provide families with amenities creating a lifetime of great memories.

We have worked very hard to provide citizens with multiple ways of keeping current on City information. The City has a Facebook page (www.facebook.com/CityofAlamoHeights/), a revamped City website (www.alamoheightstx.gov), and a City E-Blast system for updated City information via email. # Yard work Regulations

With Spring approaching, many residents are beginning to work on landscaping projects and hiring contractors to complete yard work.

- Contractors who are providing landscape and/or tree trimming services are required to remove all tree/shrub limb cuttings, grass clippings, and leaves after they complete the work.
- All grass clippings or leaves are to be bagged. If yard work is done by a
  contractor the bags are to be hauled off by the contractor and not blown
  onto public streets or bagged and left for the City to dispose of.
- Motorized yard equipment is **not** to be used before 10:00 a.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and City-observed holidays.
