Applications are to be submitted to the City Secretary no later than 5:00 p.m. on February 14th along with a \$100 filing fee. Yard Work Regulations

With the Fall season ending and so many leaves falling off the trees, several residents are hiring yard and garden services to complete yard work.

- As a reminder, all yard and garden service providers/contractors who
 have been hired to complete landscape and/or tree trimming services are
 required to remove all tree/shrub limb cuttings, grass clippings, and leaves
 after they complete the work.
- If yard work is done by a yard and garden service provider/contractor, the bagged grass clipping and leaves are to be hauled off by the provider/ contractor and NOT blown onto public streets or bagged and left for the City to dispose of.
- Motorized yard equipment is not to be used before 10:00 a.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and City-observed holidays.
- Regulated by Code of Ordinance Chapter 9 Article III Garden and Yard Trash.

CHRISTMAS TREE Safety Tips

Happy Holidays from the Alamo Heights Fire Department! Make your holiday season a safe one. For a free "Home Safety Inspection" call AHFD 210-832-2241.



PICKING THE TREE

- Live Trees Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.
- Artificial Trees Should be labeled as fire resistant.



PLACING THE TREE

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk
- At least 3 feet away from any heat source.
- Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.



LIGHTING AND DECORATING

- Use non-flammable or flame resistant decorations.
- Replace any string of lights that have worn, broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree - more than half of the December home decoration fires are started by candles.
- Always turn off lights before leaving your home or going to bed.

BE PREPARED

- Test your smoke alarms.
- Have a Fire Extinguisher nearby.

Don't be a Victim - Be Alert!

Vehicle burglaries remain one of the most frequently reported crimes of opportunity but are the most preventable. Vehicle burglars are active year round, especially during the holiday season, prowling parking lots of malls, stores and restaurants.

When shopping, always avoid dark areas in parking lots and at ATMs. Your most important defense – BE ALERT!!! Giving the appearance of not paying attention is what criminals look for in potential victims.
