Sewer Rate Increase

You will see a couple of changes in your water bill. On January 22, 2018 an ordinance was passed approving a Sewer Rate increase of 3.6% to offset charges and costs incurred from San Antonio Water System to treat the City's wastewater. This is a "pass-through" charge that goes into effect March 2018 and will be reflected in your April bill.

Also the new 2018/2019 Winter Average sewer rate will be in effect and reflected on your April bill. Winter Averaging monitors the amount of water you use during the three complete billing cycles. The city uses the months of Nov., Dec., and Jan. consumption to average your sewer rate. If you experienced a leak during this period, the City does have an adjustment policy provided you can document repair of a leak. 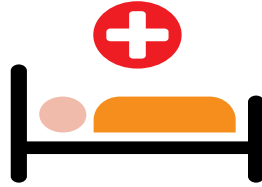

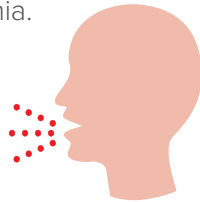
The Flu and You

Influenza (the flu) is an infection of the nose, throat and lungs caused by influenza viruses. There are many different strains of the flu virus, and they are constantly changing. These viruses cause illness, hospital stays and deaths in the U.S each year.



HOW SERIOUS IS THE FLU?

- The flu can become dangerous especially for children, the elderly and individuals who have asthma, diabetes or chronic heart disease.
- Medical conditions makes it more likely that these individuals will get complications from the flu, like pneumonia.



FLU SYMPTOMS

- Flu symptoms can include high fever, cough, sore throat, body aches, headache and rhinitis.
- There is severe fatigue and some will experience breathing problems.



STOP THE SPREAD

- Remember the **3 C's**
- **Clean** - wash your hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and water and/or use hand sanitizer. Wipe frequently touched surfaces with a cleaning cloth and disinfectant spray.
- **Cover** - Cover your cough. Use a tissue to cover you mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing. Do not use your hands.
- **Contain** - Contain germs by staying away from others who are sick. If you get sick, stay home until you are well - don't spread more germs. If you have a fever, stay home for full 24 hours after it goes away.
