# Olmos Basin Clean-up

You may have noticed in the past few weeks there has been recent clean up efforts in the Olmos Basin Area off of Jones Maltsberger and Basse Rd. This is a collaboration project between the City of Alamo Heights (COAH) and City of San Antonio (COSA) to remove trash / brush / debris in the Olmos Creek area.



Several invasive species have been removed and the tree canopy raised to 6.5'. The work at the site has been extensive with some drifts of trash exceeding 3 feet in height and the recent rains have caused more debris to collect along the creek area.

Even though this area looks like a nature trail and a great place to explore it is not all public property. Some of the land is privately

owned and part of the home-owner's backyard. Please be courteous and aware that you can not trespass on private property.

### Overnight Street Parking Permits

Reminder that the City Codes do not allow overnight parking on residential streets between the hours of 2 a.m. – 5 a.m. unless the vehicle has a visible parking permit issued by AHPD. These parking permits are for passenger cars and light trucks only. A permit can be obtained at City Hall - 6116 Broadway. There is a limit of 3 per calendar year.

# What is Recyclable?

The recycling industry is experiencing high levels of contamination which is trash or items with food or liquid residue in the recycling. When non-recyclable items (contamination) end up in the recycling loads, they have the potential to turn the entire load into trash.

Remember only certain items can be recycled:

- Metal Cans - steel, tin & aluminum soda, vegetable, fruit, and tuna cans
- Plastic bottles & containers
- Flattened Cardboard & Paperboard
- Glass bottles & Jars
- Paper - brown paper bags, non-confidential office paper, newspaper, magazines
- Paper Cardboard, Dairy & Juice Containers - after they are rinsed



### Do not include:

- Plastic bags, polystyrene foam cups, container, hangers or hazardous waste
- Food-soiled items - tissues, paper towels, cardboard or other paper that **has been in contact with food**
- Bulky items such as propane tanks or construction debris
- "Tanglers" like rubber hoses and wires - they can shut down an entire recycling center
- Sharp and dangerous materials like needles and electronics

**Do not bag your recyclables - plastic bags and film get tangled in the machinery.**
