AHISD has made a change in their school dismissal times and has added thirty (30) minutes to the end of the school day. The new school dismissal times will be 3:30 p.m. for Cambridge

Elementary and 4:00 p.m. for AH High School.

Due to the later dismissal time for Cambridge and AH High School the **NEW** afternoon **School Zone times** near both campuses has been changed to **2:30 p.m.** - **4:30 p.m.**

School begins on August 22nd and the AH Police Department urges all motorists to use caution and be alert while driving on streets around the school campuses and anywhere children may be walking

or riding their bicycles to school. Students are easily distracted this time of year and may inadvertently get too far away from the curb or cross the street without looking both ways.

Please remember the speed limit in all school zones is 20 m.p.h. Also, the use of hand-held communication devices while a vehicle is in motion is prohibited in certain school zone areas. Areas where hand-held communication devices are prohibited include St. Luke's Lane, the 6800 – 7100 blocks of Broadway (Alamo Heights H.S.), and all streets within the posted school zones of St. Peter's School and Cambridge Elementary to include the 5400 – 5900 blocks of Broadway.

Streets around school campuses can become heavily congested before and after school. If traveling through or near a school zone, please plan accordingly and expect delays.

Rules For Bike Safety

- 1. Protect Your Head Wear a helmet.
- **2. Stay Visible** If drivers can see you, they are less likely to hit you. Use lights when biking at night or in low-light conditions.
- **3. Look, Signal and Look Again** Use hand signals to let drivers know where you are going. Don't assume drivers will stop.
- **4. Stay Alert** Keep a lookout for obstacles in your path.
- **5. Go with the Flow** Bike in the direction of traffic.
- **6. Act like a Car** Do not weave in and out of traffic. Check for traffic and be aware of traffic around you.
- **7. Don't get Distracted** Do not listen to music or talk on the phone while riding.
- 8. Obey all Traffic Laws and Lights
