Credit Card Skimming: How it works, how to avoid it and deal with it



Credit card skimming is a form of credit card theft where a small device is used to steal credit card information during a credit or debit card transaction. Skimmers are small devices that scan and store credit card data from the magnetic stripe. These skimmers are usually installed at gas pumps, ATMS and other self-service point-of-sale terminals. Some skimmers use a minature camera or secondary keypad to capture your PIN number.

Credit card skimming incidents can be difficult to detect since your card is actually never lost or stolen. The best way to detect a skimmed credit card is to watch your account frequently - monitor your checking and credit card account at least weekly and immediately report any suspicious activity.

If your bank or credit card has been comprimised contact your bank/credit card issuer immediately. Call first and then follow up in writing. In most incidents if your credit card informaton has been stolen, you won't be liable for any fraudulent charges. Place a fraud alert on your credit report. This will force businesses to confirm your identity before approving application in your name. Also contact the Federal Trade Commission - they often break up large credit card skimming rings so your complaint can help catch the thieves.


