Traffic Control Sign Obstruction



The rainfall amounts received this year have contributed to an accelerated growth of grass, shrubs, and trees. Shrub and tree limbs have grown in length and become laden with new and thicker foliage. While their beauty is enhanced, some trees and shrubs on corner lots have become so dense and grown to such heights and lengths they obstruct traffic control signs and street identification signs from the vision of approaching motorists.

Code Compliance Officer and public works personnel are actively working to identify obstructed traffic control signs to provide for safe vehicular approaches to intersections. Residents who live on corner lots are asked to check their trees and shrubs and, if necessary, trim away all branches and foliage obstructing a clear view of traffic control signs. Traffic control signs should be unobstructed to provide clear visibility to approaching motorists for a distance of 100 feet before arriving at an intersection. Please help us in providing for safe intersections in our community. Here are some examples of shrubs, plants and trees that need to be trimmed.
