May General Election

The **General Election** will be **cancelled** due to unopposed candidates. Councilmember **Bobby Rosenthal** will be *Mayor*. Incumbent **Lawson Jessee** will continue to be *Councilmember Place* **1** and **Wes Sharples** will serve as *Councilmember Place* **2**. They will serve for a two-year term beginning May 22, 2017. *Congratulations*!

The City contracted with the Bexar County Elections Division to conduct Early Voting and Election Day activities for the **May 6, 2017 Special Election**. The special election is for the adoption of a new local sales and use tax in the City of Alamo Heights at the rate of one-fourth of one percent to provide additional revenue for maintenance and repair of municipal streets and sidewalks.

Early Voting: Alamo Heights voters will be able to vote at any polling site throughout Bexar County, beginning **Monday, April 24th through Tuesday, May 2nd.** Varying times and polling sites are available on website, *www. alamoheightstx.gov and www.bexar.org/elections.*

- Alamo Heights ISD Administration Building located at 7101 Broadway
- Lion's Field Community Center located at 2809 Broadway
- Tobin Library located at 4134 Harry Wurzbach

Curbside Voting:

- If you are physically unable to enter the polling place, you may ask that an election officer bring a ballot to you at the entrance of the polling place or to your car at curbside.
- Plan ahead so election officials will expect you. Call 210-335-0362 to arrange curbside voting in advance.

Yardwork Regulations

With Spring approaching many residents are beginning to work on landscaping projects and hiring contractors to complete yard work.

- Contractors who are providing landscape and/or tree trimming services are required to remove all tree/shrub limb cuttings, grass clippings and leaves after they complete the work.
- All grass clippings or leaves are to be bagged and hauled off by the contractor and not blown onto public streets or bagged and left for the City to dispose of.
- Contractors are not to begin working before 10:00 a.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and Cityobserved holidays.
- If you have any questions on the City Codes that regulate yard work contact Public Works at 882-1518.

Mosquito Control

With all the moisture in the air mosquitoes have found ideal breeding grounds. By following some tips residents can assist with the effort to reduce the mosquito numbers and helps protect yourself from being bitten.

- DRAIN Eliminate any potential standing water on your property.
- DEFEND Use an EPAregistered mosquito repellent such as DEET, Picardidin or oil of lemon eucalyptus.
- DRESS Wear light colored, loose fitting clothing that minimizes skin exposure.

What to Do During Severe Weather

Recently our City was hit by severe storms and just a few miles down a tornado touch down in San Antonio. During these storms many were not aware that Bexar County was under a Tornado Warning. It is important to know what resources are available to obtain emergency information during severe weather or other emergencies. Emergency information is broadcast on the Emergency Alert System (such National Weather System), on local radio and television stations, the NOAA weather radio (which can be purchased at retail outlet such as sporting goods stores or hardware stores) and the Cable Interrupt System. If an emergency

occurs, it is essential for you to know what to do and what not to do.

Always remember in an emergency, it is up to you to determine what action is appropriate. Develop a plan for you and your family at home, work, school, and when you are outdoors. Both the American Red Cross at www.redcross.org and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) at www.ready.gov offers tips on how to develop a plan and what you need in your emergency supply kit.
