No Bulky Items

As a reminder there are certain items that are not picked up by the Public Works Solid Waste Department.

- Furniture
- Water Heaters
- Refrigerators
- A/C Units
- Stoves
- Mattresses
- Construction material that doesn't fit in a garbage can
- Anything that is not broken down or cut-up in 3 foot lengths and weighs more than 40 lbs.

* Remember landscaping contractors are required to dispose of all materials they trim/cut.

Street Parking Permits

During the summer months residential driveways often become overcrowded with long term visitors and students returning home for summer vacation. Situations such as these often times result in vehicles being parked in the street during the overnight hours.

- The City Codes do not allow overnight parking on residential streets between the hours of 2 a.m. – 5 a.m.
- Unless the vehicle has a visible parking permit issued by the Police Department
- Street parking permits for passenger cars and light trucks may be obtained from the Police Administrative Office
- Street parking permits are not authorized for motor homes, travel trailers, utility trailers, boats, etc.

The goals of the Code Compliance Officer are to proactively inspect properties to improve and maintain the beauty, health and safety of the City by informing citizens of statute and ordinances.

Escape Planning



Plan a home escape plan - it could save your life. You and your family only have minutes to get out safely if a fire breaks out in your home. Everyone needs to know what to do and where to go if a fire occurs.

- Make a home escape plan by “mapping” the layout of your home. Review the plan of where to go with everyone in your home.

- Know at least 2 ways out of every room and ensure all doors and windows open easily.
- Designate a “Safe Place” outside of your home where all family members meet once they’re out of the home.
- Practice your “fire drills” at home during the day as well as at night, several times until everyone is comfortable. Practice using different ways out.
- While 71% households have an escape plan in case of a fire, only 47% actually practice it.
- Teach children how to escape on their own, in case adults are not at home, or inside the structure.
- Stay low if smoke conditions are present.
- Get out and stay out. Call 911.

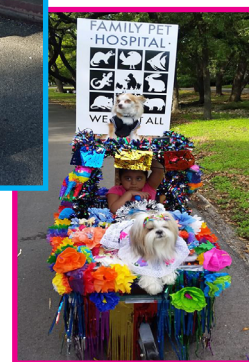
