What is Recyclable?

Recently a study was conducted on the City's "recycled" items and it showed that there is a lot of non-recyclable items being placed in the green recycle bins. Remember only certain items can be recycled:

- Metal Cans steel, tin & aluminum soda, vegetable, fruit and tuna cans
- Plastic bottles & containers
- Paper brown paper bags, non-confidential office paper, newspaper, magazines
- Paper Cardboard, Dairy & Juice Containers
- Flattened Cardboard & Paperboard
- Glass bottles & Jars

Do not include: Food waste, plastic bags, polystyrene foam cups, containers, hangers or hazardous waste

- Paper and cardboard must be dry and free of food debris
- Tissues, paper towels or other paper that has been in contact with food is not acceptable
- Make sure food contamination and caps are removed from cans and plastics and all containers are empty
