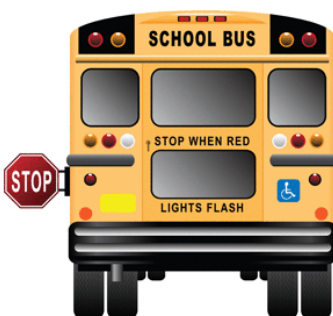

School Zone Safety

School begins on August 15th. Alamo Heights Police Department urges all motorists to use caution and be more alert while driving on streets around the school campuses and anywhere children may be walking or riding their bicycles to school. Students are easily distracted this time of year and may inadvertently get too far away from the curb or cross the street without looking both ways.

Remember the speed limit in ALL school zones is 20 m.p.h.

Streets around school campuses can become heavily congested before and after school. If traveling through or near a school zone, please plan accordingly and expect delays.



OBEY TEXAS SCHOOL BUS LAW

- Stop for flashing red lights on a school bus, regardless of which direction you're headed
- Continue your trip once the flashing lights stop flashing
- Violations can lead to a \$1,000 fine



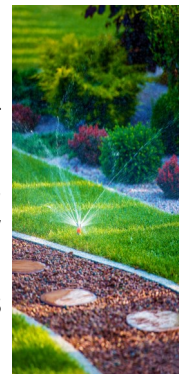
NO CELL PHONES IN SCHOOL ZONES

- No cell phone use in school zones
- Drivers under the age of 18 are prohibited from using wireless communication devices
- Drivers cannot send or receive electronic messages in Texas

Stage 3 Water Restrictions

Friendly reminder that the City is currently under Stage 3 Water Restrictions, effective June 17th.

- Landscape watering is permitted once EVERY OTHER week from 7am-11am and 7pm-11pm. The last number of your address determines what day.
- Hand watering with a hand-held hose, soaker hose, drip irrigation system, or bucket is allowed any day from 7am-11am and 7pm-11pm.
