Stage 3 Water Restrictions in Effect

Effective July 30, 2024, the City of Alamo Heights has declared Stage 3 Water Restrictions. These are changes mandated by order if the Edwards Aquifer Authority.

Landscaping Watering (using automatic or manual irrigation systems) is permitted **only once EVERY OTHER week** between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. The last number of your address determines what day you are able to water. **You may water once during the week of July 29th and it is a non-watering week during the week of August 5th.**

<i>Last number of your Address</i>	<i>Watering Day</i>
0 or 1	Monday
2 or 3	Tuesday
4 or 5	Wednesday
6 or 7	Thursday
8 or 9	Friday
Multi-Family premises, schools, churches and commercial users	Wednesday

You may use drip irrigation, soaker hose, or bucket (5-gallon or less container) during any day of the week but only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and 7:00p.m. to 11:00 p.m. A hand-held hose may be used any day of the week at any time.

School Zone Safety

School begins on August 21st. AH Police Department urges all motorists to use caution and be more alert while driving on streets around the school campuses and anywhere children may be walking or riding their bicycles to school. Students are easily distracted this time of year and may inadvertently get too far away from the curb or cross the street without looking both ways.

Remember the speed limit in ALL school zones is 20 m.p.h.

Streets around school campuses can become heavily congested before and after school. If traveling through or near a school zone, please plan accordingly and expect delays.



1: OBEY TEXAS SCHOOL BUS LAW

- Stop for flashing red lights on a school bus, regardless of which direction you're headed
- Continue your trip once the flashing lights stop flashing
- Violations can lead to a \$1,000 fine

2: NO CELL PHONES IN SCHOOL ZONES

- No cell phone use in school zones
- No cell phone use by teens while driving who received license after Sept 1, 2009
- Beware of the posted signs designating the NO cell phone zones

RECYCLE RIGHT. Things you can do to ensure quality material is recycled:



DO NOT INCLUDE: Food waste, plastic bags, polystyrene foam cups & containers, hangers or hazardous waste

- Paper and cardboard must be dry and free of food debris.
- Tissues, paper towels or other paper that has been in contact with food is not acceptable.
- Make sure food contamination and caps are removed from cans and plastics and all containers are empty.
- Separate plastic lids from plastic bottles (often made from different materials).
- Do not place medical waste (needles, catheters or lancets) into the recycling containers.
