Items for Individual Consideration

Item # 1 Mayor Pro Tem Billa Burke read the following caption.

ORDINANCE NO. 2171

AN ORDINANCE CANVASSING THE RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF A SPECIAL ELECTION TO REAUTHORIZE THE LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX FOR MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR OF MUNICIPAL STREETS HELD IN THE CITY OF ALAMO HEIGHTS, TEXAS ON MAY 1, 2021

City Secretary Elsa T. Robles presented the official results of the special election held on May 1, 2021. Ms. Robles reported the City of Alamo Heights had a proposition for the reauthorization of local sales and use tax at the rate of one-half of one percent to continue providing revenue for maintenance and repair of municipal streets. There was a total of 1,446 voters who cast their ballots. She separated the total votes by Early Voting, Election Day, and Absentee/Mail-In Ballots in their respective Precincts – 3020, 3025, and 3026.

Ms. Robles cited Election Code 67.002 which mandates a canvass of the election results to make them official. As the local governing authority, Council would need to make a motion to canvass the results.

Before Council made their motion, Mayor Pro Tem Billa Burke thanked the citizens who voted during the special election.

Ms. Robles also took the opportunity to thank all the departments who helped make election day successful.

Councilmember Wes Sharples moved to approve Ordinance No. 2171 canvassing the May 1, 2021 Special Election returns and results. The motion was seconded by Councilmember John Savage and passed by unanimous vote.
