


CANDLE SAFETY TIPS



Alamo Heights Fire Department would like to inform our community of the dangers of using candles in your houses, and give some helpful recommendations to help keep our families safe for the holidays. From 2015-2019, U.S. fire departments responded to an estimated 7,400 home structure fires that were started by candles per year. These fires caused an annual average of 90 deaths, 670 injuries, and \$291 million in direct property damage. On average, 20 home candle fires are reported each day. Thanksgiving and Christmas are the peak days for candle fires.

SAFETY TIPS AND SUGGESTIONS

- Keep candles at least 12 inches from anything that can burn such as window drapes.
- They do make flameless candles for your home. They look and smell just like real candles without the risk of fire.
- Always blow out all candles before you leave a room or go to bed!

There is no such thing as "Flushable wipes"

Unfortunately manufacturers are able to make the claim. Toilet paper dissolves in sewage pipes but tissues, paper towels, and wipes do not. Instead of dissolving like toilet paper, these items bond together with grease forming long, mop-like clumps of gunk that clog sewer pipes, damage equipment and cause sewer spills. Dispose of these wipes and other products deemed "flushable" in the trash, along with grease from plates, pots and pans and you can help prevent this problem.


