### Home Safety Inspection can find unseen hazards

Half of home heating fires are reported during the months of December, January, and February.

The Alamo Heights Fire Department continues to promote the benefits of the free home safety inspection. Firefighters will complete a detailed checklist at your home to identify potential hazards and make recommendations to mitigate the hazards. Checking the lint trap and lint duct of your clothes dryer is just one of the fire safety issues the firefighters can address, using a special camera. The colder weather offers additional issues that can pose hazards to you and your family. Colder weather also poses increased risks with heating systems and the use of portable space heaters. - Keep anything that can burn at least three-feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container.
- Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.
- Test smoke alarms monthly.
