Candidate applications to serve on the Alamo Heights City Council

The Mayor and Councilmembers Place 1 and 2 are elected in a general election in May in odd calendar years. Candidates serve a two-year term on the Alamo Heights City Council. Election day is Saturday, May 1, 2021.

The candidate filing period is Wednesday, January 13, 2021 through Friday, February 12, 2021. Applications will be submitted to the City Secretary no later than 5:00 p.m. on February 12th along with a \$100 filing fee. Candidate packets are available at City Hall, 6116 Broadway, San Antonio, TX 78209 by appointment and on the City's website.

Candidate Qualifications for City Council

- Must be United States citizen.
- Must be a qualified voter on the date of election.
- Have resided in the City for a year preceding the election.
- Has not been determined mentally incompetent by a final judgment of a court.
- Has not been finally convicted of a felony from which the candidate has not been pardoned or otherwise.
- Must satisfy any other eligibility requirements prescribed by law.

Do I need to wear a mask and avoid close contact with others if I have received 2 doses of the vaccine?

Yes. While experts learn more about the protection that COVID-19 vaccines provide under real-life conditions, it will be important for everyone to continue using **all the tools** available to us to help stop this pandemic, like covering your mouth and nose with a mask, washing hands often, and staying at least 6 feet away from others. Together, COVID-19 vaccination and following CDC's recommendations for [how to protect yourself and others](#) will offer the best protection from getting and spreading COVID-19. Experts need to understand more about the protection that COVID-19 vaccines provide before deciding to change recommendations on steps everyone should take to slow the spread of the virus that causes COVID-19. Other factors, including how many people get vaccinated and how the virus is spreading in communities, will also affect this decision.
