Stage 3 Water Restrictions in Effect

Effective July 3, 2023, the City of Alamo Heights has declared Stage 3 Water Restrictions. These are changes mandated by order of the Edwards Aquifer Authority

Landscaping Watering (using automatic or manual irrigation systems) is permitted **only once EVERY OTHER week** between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. The last number of your address determines what day you are able to water. You may water once during the week of July 3rd and it is a non-watering week during the week of July 10th.

You may use drip irrigation, soaker hose, or bucket (5-gallon or less container) during any day of the week but only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and 7:00p.m. to 11:00 p.m. A hand-held hose may be used any day of the week at any time.
