Vehicle Burglary Trend

A growing trend in vehicle burglaries is occurring in the San Antonio metro-area called

“jugging”. Juggers stake out banks watching for customers to leave with envelopes, bank bags, etc. They will follow the person to their next destination and if the person leaves the vehicle without the envelope/bank bag, the jugger will force entry to the vehicle and steal the envelope/bank bag in hopes it contains cash. Avoid being a victim of jugging:

1. Watch for small to mid-size vehicles having dark tinted glass backed into parking spaces at a bank or adjoining parking lot;
2. Do not carry envelope/bank bags in open view when returning to your vehicle or make any movement that would appear you are hiding something in the vehicle;
3. Do not make unnecessary stops at stores, restaurants, etc. after visiting a bank before getting to your final destination;
4. If you notice a suspicious vehicle in a bank parking lot, please make a bank employee or security guard aware.

All envelopes, briefcases, back packs, computer bags, purses, etc. should never be left in open view within the passenger compartment.

CALL 911

- Move person to a cooler area
- Loosen clothing and remove extra layers
- Cool with water or ice

Heat exhaustion can lead to heat stroke.
