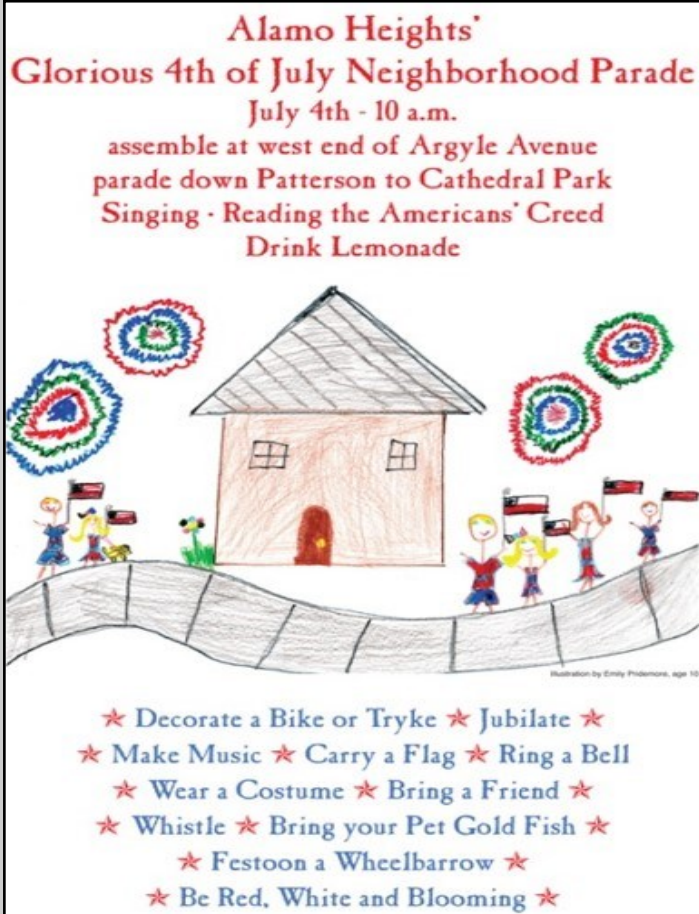

## What is Recyclable?

The recycling industry is experiencing high levels of contamination which is trash or items with food or liquid residue in the recycling. When non-recyclable items (contamination) end up in the recycling loads, they have the potential to turn the entire load into trash.

Remember only certain items can be recycled:

- Metal Cans - steel, tin & aluminum soda, vegetable, fruit, and tuna cans
- Plastic bottles & containers
- Flattened Cardboard & Paperboard
- Glass bottles & Jars
- Paper - brown paper bags, non-confidential office paper, newspaper, magazines
- Paper Cardboard, Dairy & Juice Containers - after they are rinsed



### Do not include:

- Plastic bags, polystyrene foam cups, container, hangers or hazardous waste
- Food-soiled items - tissues, paper towels, cardboard or other paper that **has been in contact with food**
- Bulky items such as propane tanks or construction debris
- "Tanglers" like rubber hoses and wires - they can shut down an entire recycling center
- Sharp and dangerous materials like needles and electronics

**Do not bag your recyclables - plastic bags and film get tangled in the machinery.**
