The Bexar Appraisal District (BCAD) mailed 2026 Notices of Appraised Value to new property owners and to those whose property market value has increased by \$1,000 or more from last year. Property owners have until May 15, 2026, or 30 days after receiving their notice to appeal their appraised value.

Accessibility Changes for City's Website

The City of Alamo Heights website has transformed to meet the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG 2.2). These mandates are regulated by the Department of Justice (DOJ) to ensure web content and mobile applications are accessible to people with disabilities.

The website allows accessibility interface that allows individuals with specific disabilities to adjust the website's UI (user interface) and design it to their personal needs.

Complying with those guidelines helps us ensure that the website is accessible to blind people, people with motor impairments, visual impairment, cognitive disabilities and more.

There are may still be pages or sections not fully accessible but are in the process of becoming accessible or lack adequate technological solution to make them accessible. We are continually improving accessibility.
