
CPS Energy Tree Trimming

On April 25th, a presentation was made by CPS Energy regarding their Energy Reliability and Vegetation Maintenance Program. Beginning in May, a certified line clearance tree trimming contractor, Asplundh, will be trimming trees on public and private property in Ala-

mo Heights on CPS Energy's behalf. This service is provided at no cost and is intended to increase the reliability of electrical service for customers.

Clearances are critical to maintain the electrical system. CPS Energy requires 10 feet of clearance from distribution lines. Qualified and certified personnel and contractors ensure the safety for crews and the health of the trees. Due to safety & reliability risks, residents are not authorized to trim their own trees within this 10 feet area. For trimming

near the service drop to homes, customers are encouraged to call to schedule a temporary disconnect to ensure safety. For more information, please call CPS Energy at 210-353 -2222.
