

# NEW TRASH BINS



The City of Alamo Heights is upgrading to new standardized wheeled trash bins for all residents beginning in November 2025. These durable bins provide more capacity, easier movement, and faster, cleaner collection for the community. Public Works staff will deliver bins directly to each home at no cost—residents west of Broadway will receive theirs Nov. 10 – Dec. 8, and those east of Broadway Dec. 8 – Dec. 30. Your regular trash pickup day will not change. A grace period will remain in effect through February 6, 2026, allowing residents to continue using their old containers until that date, when only the new bins will be collected.

Bins will not be delivered on holidays, including Veterans Day, Thanksgiving, Black Friday, or Christmas Day.

Reminder: Your water consumption during the winter months affects your residential sewer service fee for the next year. Residential sewer service fees are calculated based on the average water usage during three consecutive billing periods. This year your November, December, and January consumption will be used for your winter averaging.

# Tips for Safe Thanksgiving Leftovers

# 2 hour rule

Refrigerate perishable items within two hours of coming out of the oven or refrigerator to prevent the rapid growth of bacteria.

Reheat to 165° F

Use the Monday after
Thanksgiving as a reminder that
it is the last day you can safely
eat leftovers. If you want to keep
leftovers longer, freeze them within
that four-day period.



Make sure your reheated leftovers reach 165° F as measured with a food thermometer. Reheat sauces, soups and gravies safely by bringing them to a rolling boil.

## 5 TIPS TO PREVENT DELIVERY PACKAGE THEFT

Between Thanksgiving and New Years is the time when most parcel thefts happen.

Always be aware and careful.

- Request notifications on your deliveries, via phone, text message or email.
   Monitor your packages in transit and upon delivery.
- Always require a signature on your deliveries to ensure packages are never left unattended.
- Consider sending deliveries to an alternate location where someone will be able to receive them, or to the shipping companies pick up location/Post Office.
- Schedule your deliveries for a date and time when you're expected to be home.
- Set up a vacation hold if you plan on traveling during the holidays so gifts won't be left on the doorstep.
- Call your local police department if you should become a "Porch Pirate" victim.
