

Olmos Basin Clean-up

You may have noticed in the past few weeks there has been recent clean up efforts in the Olmos Basin Area off of Jones Maltsberger and Basse Road. This is a collaboration project between the City of Alamo Heights (COAH) and the City of San Antonio (COSA) to remove trash/brush/debris in the Olmos Creek area.



Several invasive species have been removed and the tree canopy raised to 6.5'. The work at the site has been extensive with some drifts of trash exceeding 3' in height and the recent rains have caused more debris to collect along the creek area.

Even though this area looks like a nature trail and a great place to explore it is not all public property.

Voter Centers in Bexar County

During the November election, voters can vote at any Bexar County designated polling site.

Voter Center Model—with the Voter Center Model, the voter can vote at any Bexar County Election Day designated polling sites just as similar to Early Voting. Early Voting allows a voter to vote anywhere Bexar County has designated as their polling sites during Early Voting period. On Election Day, voters can vote at **any** polling site (voter center) within Bexar County. The Voter Center Model has been adopted to decrease the number of provisional ballots and provide additional convenience.

The City of Alamo Heights does not have any city-related items on the November 2nd General, Special, Bond Election ballot; however, City Hall will be a Voter Center (polling site) on Tuesday, November 2nd as an Election Day polling site from 7 a.m.—7 p.m.
