Austin Highway/Lower Broadway Improvement Project

What is the Austin Highway/Lower Broadway Improvement Project?

The Austin Highway/Lower Broadway Improvement Project consists of lower Broadway (Austin Highway to Burr - .7 miles), including Broadway and Austin Highway for a total amount of 1.13 miles for:

- Street, sidewalk and bike lane
- Storm Water Drainage and underground utilities
- Landscaping Improvements

All funded by different entities with the bulk of work being primarily along Broadway.

If this bond passes, will there be future community meetings to discuss and provide input on design of Broadway?

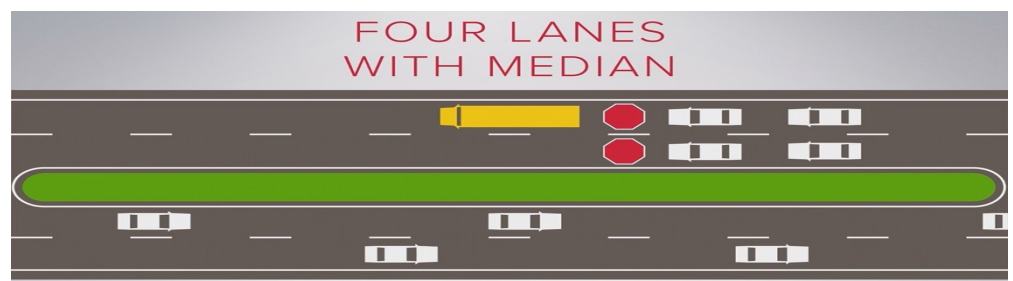
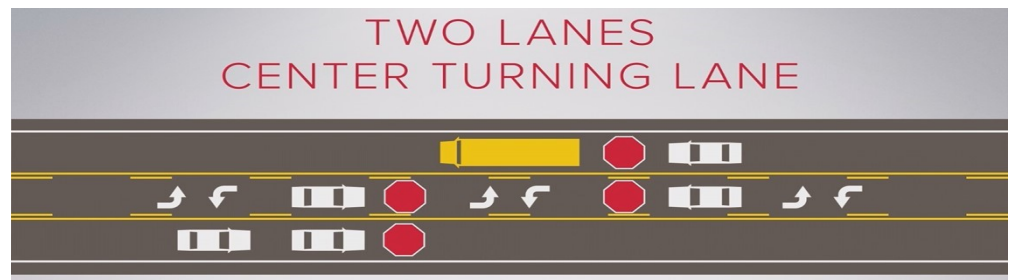
School Zone Safety

Per the recommendation of the Bexar County Metro Health department school began remotely on August 17th. Face to face learning will begin on Tuesday, September 8, 2020, depending on the local health situation at that time. The Alamo Heights Police Department urges all motorists to use caution and be more alert while driving on streets around the school campuses and anywhere children may be walking or riding their bicycles to school. Students are easily distracted this time of year and may inadvertently get too far away from the curb or cross the street without looking both ways.

Remember that the speed limit in ALL school zones is 20 m.p.h.

Streets around school campuses can become heavily congested before and after school. If traveling through or near a school zone, please plan accordingly and expect delays.

According to Texas law, drivers have to stop when a school bus extends its stop sign or when it turns on its flashing red lights. Examples of when you must stop are:
