What is Recyclable?

Remember only certain items can be recycled:

- Metal Cans steel, tin & aluminum soda, vegetable, fruit, and tuna cans
- Plastic bottles & containers
- Paper brown paper bags, non-confidential office paper, newspaper, magazines
- Paper Cardboard, Dairy & Juice Containers
- Flattened Cardboard & Paperboard
- Glass bottles & Jars

Do not include:

- Food Waste, plastic bags, polystyrene foam cups, container, hangers or hazardous waste
- Tissues, paper towels, cardboard or other paper that has been in contact with food

Make sure food contamination and caps are removed from cans and plastics and all containers are empty.

Stage 4 Water Restrictions

The City of Alamo Heights has declared Stage 4 Water Restrictions based on mandatory pumping restrictions by the Edwards Aquifer, which was effective July 24, 2023. Watering with automatic or manual irrigation systems is permitted only once EVERY OTHER week between the hours of 7am and 11am and 7pm to 11pm. The last number of your address determines what day you are able to water. The week of September 4th, 2023 is a non-watering week.


School Zone Safety

The Alamo Heights Police Department urges all motorists to use caution and be more alert while driving on streets around the school campuses and anywhere children may be walking or riding their bicycles to school. Students are easily distracted this time of year and may inadvertently get too far away from the curb or cross the street without looking both ways.

Remember that the speed limit in ALL school zones is 20 m.p.h.

Streets around school campuses can become heavily congested before and after school. If traveling through or near a school zone, please plan accordingly and expect delays.

According to Texas law, drivers have to stop when a school bus extends its stop sign or when it turns on its flashing red lights. Examples of when you must stop are:
